## **Bucky Mitchell BIO**

Bucky Mitchell, born in Portland in 1951, has been playing country music since he was 19-years-old and played with the house band, Rick Wells & the Wagon Wheels, at the Wagon Wheel Ranch in Steep Falls (1970). The house band also backed up Capitol Records star Dick Curless, who invited Bucky to go with him to Nashville for a Grand Ole Opry appearance. That experience convinced Bucky that he wanted to make a career in country music.

During his two years at the Wagon Wheel Ranch, Bucky, a drummer, played for many known WWVA artists including (besides Curless) Kenny Roberts, Betty Cody, Wayne Kemp, and Lee Moore. In '72, WWVA Jamboree member Stan Jr. came to the Wagon Wheel and offered Bucky a job in a full-time touring band. Bucky toured the eastern United States with Stan Jr. for 4 years. Then, in 1977, Bucky helped found Rick Robinson and the Bayou Boys. The band recorded 2 albums and 10 singles for Belmont Records, and were named MCMAA Country Music Band of the Year in 1979 and 1980. They opened shows for many big-time country acts including Roy Clark, Hank Snow, Eddie Rabbitt, Porter Wagner, Johnny Paycheck, Emmylou Harris, and Larry Gatlin. Along the way, Bucky got to play drums for many big stars, such as Dick Curless, Dave Dudley, John Anderson, Big Al Downing, Freddie Fender, Barbara Fairchild, and Kenny Price.

Bucky was so successful booking country bands that John Penny asked him to join the John Penny Agency, which was soon to become the largest country music booking agency in New England. Bucky worked for the agency for 15 years, during which time he handled the bookings of 28 bands. During this time, he also produced recording projects for Belmont Records.

In 1992, Bucky moved back to Maine, settling in Windham. He currently plays drums and sings with Mike Preston and the Backstop Band with Kim Curry. They have a Youtube show called the BuckStop Jamboree, featuring various New England artists.

In 2014, Bucky was inducted into the Massachusetts Country Music Hall of Fame.

Bucky Mitchell has many videos to check out on Youtube.

# Maine's Very Own Bluegrass Jam Camp Makes Its Debut

Vacationland Bluegrass Camp held its inaugural weekend September14 - 17, 2017 at Searsport Shores Campground, in Searsport, Maine. Thirty students attended, ranging in age from 14 to 82. While most of the students came from Maine, others traveled from as far away as Florida, North Carolina, Wisconsin, Scotland and Australia.

Some of Maine's finest bluegrass musicians were on hand as instructors, including Erica Brown (fiddle), Matt Shipman (guitar), Steve Roy (upright bass), Carter Logan (banjo), Baron Collins-Hill (mandolin), and Frets Halligan (ukulele). Resa Randolph (Miners Creek) taught an additional 6 hours of novice jamming and vocal workshops.

Searsport Shores Campground owners Steve and Astrig Tanguay were perfect hosts, providing not only an idyllic location on the shores of Penobscot Bay, but also a bring-your-own-toppings pizza bar on Friday, breakfast waffle bar on Saturday and Sunday, as well as Saturday lunch.

After many long hours of jamming, students were treated to a fantastic teacher concert on Saturday evening, featuring Frets & Friends, Miners Creek and Darlin' Corey, and catered by Chef on the Run food truck. Students then had their own chance to shine on stage on Sunday afternoon with the graduation student concert.

# YOUNG MAINE FIDDLERS IN TENNESSEE - PART TWO SARAH JEANNE LOGAN

Sarah Jeanne Logan is a young fiddler and singer with a very bright future someone Maine bluegrass fans are going to be proud of for a good long time.

In the last issue of Bluegrass Express, I wrote about Jay Smith, a young fiddler from Maine now making his way as a full-time musician out of Nashville. In this installment, I'm going to focus on Sarah Jeanne Logan, a very talented young lady who has been absorbing bluegrass from a very young age, and who is continuing that absorption as a full-time student in the bluegrass program at East Tennessee, and also as a member of the up-and-coming band, Wilson Banjo Company.

Sarah was born in Portland and grew up in Gorham, the daughter of Carter and Robin Logan. Carter, originally from Charlottesville, Virginia (attended high school with bluegrass celebrity Sammy Shelor), is known to Maine bluegrass fans as the banjoist/dobroist with the Jerks of Grass, a long-standing Portland band, and a well-known teacher of banjo and other instruments.



Sarah started playing fiddle at about age five; Melissa Brandon, Jack Devereux, Erica Brown, and Don Roy were some of her teachers, and she also attended Maine Fiddle Camp for many years. While attending Gorham High School, she played regularly with Night 317, a band made of students at Yarmouth's 317 Main Street Community Music Center (the band was managed by her dad, Carter); Flight 317 recorded an EP during Sarah's stint with the band.

Sarah also played many gigs with the Jerks of Grass. During her early childhood, in fact, she was called, "the littlest jerk," and she used to stand on stage with the band holding a fiddle even before she could play one. Eventually she graduated to playing fiddle and singing with the Jerks, and she still performs with the band when she's back in Maine.

After graduating from Gorham High in 2015, Sarah moved to Johnson City, Tennessee to major in bluegrass music studies at East Tennessee University. (Max Silverstein, another Maine-grown fiddler, who we'll cover in the next installment of this series, is also enrolled in ETU's bluegrass program.)

An important coincident occurred in early 2017 when Melanie Wilson saw a video of Sarah performing on Facebook. Melanie is the wife of Steve Wilson, a banjo maker and leader/founder of the Wilson Banjo Company, a bluegrass band operating out of upstate South Carolina. Melanie, who also serves as publicist and booking agent for the band, liked what she saw in the video and contacted Sarah to see if she'd be interested in trying out for a role in the Wilson Banjo Company. Sarah sat in at a band practice, and has been with them ever since.

In October of this year, the Wilson Banjo Company released a CD, *Spirit in the Hills*; the first single from the album is *Ain't No Grave*, and the video, featuring Sarah's soulful lead vocal, and some sparkling harmony, is easily findable on Youtube.

Sarah loves being in the Wilson Banjo Company, and appreciates the friendship and musical support the Wilsons have given her. The band will showcase at the SPBGMA convention in Nashville in February followed by a show in Galax, Virginia; Johnson City, Nashville, and Galax are all cities of enormous historical significance to bluegrass, so it's safe to say that Sarah is operating in an environment that will strengthen and sharpen her bluegrass sensibilities.

Some of Sarah's favorite fiddlers are Alison Krauss, Jack Devereux, Stuart Duncan, Jason Carter, and Bobby Hicks. Her favorite bluegrass singers include Alison Krauss, Paul Brewster, Clay Hess, Tim Shelton, Shawn Lane, and Ricky Skaggs; she also likes country singers Vince Gill, Alan Jackson, Joe Diffie, Brad Paisley, and Mark Chesnutt. Alison Krauss and Union Station, The Boxcars, Volume Five, The Clay Hess Band, Southern Connection, and Sideline are among her favorite bands.

Besides college and playing and singing bluegrass music, Sarah enjoys horseback riding and going on adventures with her boyfriend Brady Wallen and her dog, Mr. Bojangles.

Maine bluegrass fans wanting to know and hear more about Sarah can find her in videos of the Wilson Banjo Company and the Jerks of Grass on Youtube. The Wilson Banjo Company has a nice website (www.wilsonbanjo.com) with many interesting links.



Stan gladly accepted his award, but had already won with this number when Ralph Sanley II recorded it for his first, and eponymous album leading The Clinch Mountain boys earlier this year.

I look forward to hearing about all the bluegrass events you've got going on in this great state.



#### **SOUTHERN JAM REPORT**

Our Southern Jam is regularly scheduled at North Yarmouth Academy on the Second Sunday of the month, October through April, from Noon to Five PM. The jam takes place at the music facilities building. Parking is readily available in a lot accessible from Main Street in Yarmouth.

The number of pickers varies from month to month, but is typically between twenty and thirty players of varying levels. Some play regularly in working bands, while others are just learning the chords to some of the old standard. There are several different picking spaces, so all levels of players are readily accommodated and can pick among their peers; our attendees have appreciated that flexibility. There is plenty of space available for listeners as well. We have a refreshment table; refreshments are brought by volunteers -- usually a hot dish along with some cheese, crackers, and vegetables with some good healthy dips. Sometime there are sweets as well, but food is not sold nor prepared at the Jam.

#### **EASTERN JAM REPORT**
