
MandoLessons — An Outstanding(!) Mandolin Instruction Website

I recently stumbled upon a Mandolin Web Lesson site that is so good that I immediately felt that I had to report on it to our readers. The site is called MandoLessons, and it's all free, and created and maintained by a local musician, Baron Collins-Hill of Belfast, Maine.

People of all all ages who are trying to learn, and master, a musical instrument will pay \$20, \$30, or often much more per item for books with CDs attached, subscription on-line lessons, and personal teachers. Their degree of satisfaction with packaged lessons is, of course, varied. One common complaint is that the lessons are so far over the head of the student that discouragement ensues. Sometimes the problem is the teacher doesn't play it slowly enough for the student to catch the subtleties. Sometimes there's no tablature, or the tablature is messy or vague. Sometimes, the student is only interested in a few of the tunes included in the package. No such problems here.

Everything in MandoLessons is clearly presented. The quality of the video is very high, and the audio is great, too. Even though there's an emphasis on rote learning (a tried-and-true method for pickers) there are tablatures available with a simple click on a link, and the tabs are top notch.

As for finding tunes that you're interested in learning to play, there are so many tunes and songs (over 150) on this site, that almost any lover of traditional string band music will find plenty that he likes, and there is a wide range of difficulty levels, as well.

As for genres, there are more Old Time tunes (70) and Irish tunes (59) than any other, but at least 13 tunes are listed as Bluegrass — *Salt Creek, Bill Cheatham*, etc. And many other tunes are adaptable to Bluegrass.

There are also 3-to-5-part lessons on these song breaks, which will be of interest to Bluegrass pickers: *Man of Constant Sorrow, Nine Pound Hammer, Will the Circle Be Unbroken, Shady Grove;* and a 1-part lesson on *Wayfaring Stranger.*


ANNUAL MEETING

Sample Tab from MandoLessons


Besides tune lessons, there are all kinds of other lessons available on this site — a few sample lesson titles: How to Build Chords; Pick Directions - How to Play Reels; How to Follow Guitar Players, Part 2 - Capo Placement; Split String; Cross Picking; several Music Theory Lessons; and much more. Aspiring mandolinists up to a very advanced (e.g., professional) level can easily find some lessons that are of value on this site.

Here's an example of how you might use the MandoLessons site to learn *Blackberry Blossom*, which is listed as an Advanced Fiddle Tune. Watch the 18-minute Video Lesson — which has very clear video and audio. In the Video Lesson, Baron plays the tune at a moderate speed and then adroitly breaks it down into phrases. At the bottom of the page, there's a link to a highly-readable piece of sheet music that displays both standard notation and tablature. There are 6 audio track links on the page, too: Slow (Mandolin & Guitar); Slow (Mandolin Only); Slow (Guitar Backup Only); Fast (Mandolin & Guitar Only). (The "Fast" audio tracks are actually moderate in

speed.) An intermediate student could spend an hour or 2 on this lesson and master this tune quite thoroughly and reinforce her competence by playing it with the backup tracks.

The site is advertisement-free; Baron has been able to maintain it on a patronage basis — donations gratefully accepted. He says, "my lessons will always be free and available to anyone who wants to learn." He offers some email support, as well.

This is one of the best stringed instrument resources I have ever come across. If you're a budding mandolin player, or even *a mandolin player* (budding or not), you should definitely check out MandoLessons (www.mandolessons.com).

Our price for membership has stayed at \$12 (solo) and \$15 (duet) all these years even though our costs have risen annually since then. MAINE COUNTRY MUSIC HALL OF FAME NOMINATIONS DUE BY DECEMBER 31

Below are the instructions for nominating someone to the Maine Country Music Hall of Fame.

You will find the nomination form on Page 5.

FURTHER INSTRUCTIONS AND REQUIREMENTS

- 1. To qualify as a Nominee a person must be of good character and to have made a significant contribution toward the preservation, promotion and/or performing of COUNTRY MUSIC WITHIN THE STATE OF MAINE. Please expound on the background.
- 2. Each nomination must be submitted on the official "Hall of Fame Nomination Form" -Please only <u>ONE NOMINEE/DUO PER FORM</u>. A DUO may constitute one nominee. Additional information MUST be supplied on 8 1/2 x 11 white paper, typed or printed clearly, and attached to the Nomination form. Include one recent 5x7 black & white or color professional appearing photograph.
- 3. On a separate sheet please submit a detailed biography of nominees background to include first musical or entertainment interests, influences, earliest know dates and locations of performances, such as: stage, dances, TV, radio, recordings, etc. Also include newspaper clippings, photographs, and any documentation pertaining to nominees musical background. Tell if nominee is still active in the Country Music field and what their status is. If deceased please give name and address of spouse and/or known relative or close contact person.
- 4. A nominee need not be a member of any active Country/Bluegrass Association within the State of Maine. A member may submit no more than two nominations per year and be willing to vouch for the nominee's character.
- 5. Each Nomination form <u>MUST</u> be signed by the person who is nominating along with their mailing address and telephone number. This is necessary in the event that the Induction Committee needs more information
- 6. Make copies of valuable historical material before submitting as all materials are non-returnable and become a permanent file to be used for future reference.

FAILURE TO THOROUGHLY ANSWER ALL QUESTIONS AN PROVIDE DOCUMENTATION MAY DISQUALIFY THE NOMINATION

THE BLUEGRASS GOSPEL SING AND JAM



The Bluegrass Gospel Sing and Jam® has been part of the bluegrass scene in Maine since it began in the spring of 2000. Since that time, Mike and Mary Robinson have been ministering to the community of people who enjoy and follow Bluegrass Music on the east coast from Mexico to Maine.

During their Sunday morning sing along session, they provide a free songbook with words and chords for those who wish to participate. They also encourage those who play instruments to come to join in and be their "Jam Band". During the 45 minute sing a long, Mike preaches a gospel message and encourages those in the audience with spiritual questions to seek out he and Mary around the festival grounds and at their booth during the weekend to discuss spiritual things.

After stepping out full time in early 2004, the ministry has grown to include more than 25 Bluegrass events yearly as well as numerous church services, where they garner some of their support, nursing homes and outreach activities and campgrounds.

Because of their access to this people group, Mike and Mary have the opportunity to present the gospel to many who may never enter a church and to counsel others in their spiritual walk.
