# The Pandemic's Effect on Bluegrass Music in Maine

The COVID-19 pandemic has virtually brought live music of all genres to a halt all across the United States. The Bluegrass music community in Maine has certainly felt the pervasive effects of the virus, and will continue to feel the effects for the next few months, at least.

Some of the biggest (not bluegrass) musical festivals in the nation (Lollapalooza, Coachella,

JazzFest) have been cancelled until, at the earliest, spring 2021. Many or most bigtime rock and country bands have canceled their 2020 summer tours, often rescheduling them for summer 2021. Other major artists have downscaled their schedules drastically, playing only a few of the shows originally scheduled for summer 2020.

Not as much detailed information is available about Bluegrass festivals and band tours; many Bluegrass movers and shakers are still operating on a "wait and see" basis. They can do this because huge, huge money isn't involved, and they may feel like they must hold out as long as they can because they are at risk to go broke or suffer serious financial harm if things don't go well for them.

As it is, almost all Bluegrass Festivals scheduled for April, May, June, and July 2020 have been canceled. There will be no Bluegrass Festivals in Maine until at least August, 2020. Let's now review the status of Maine Bluegrass Festivals in detail.

# MAINE AGRICULTURAL FAIRS AND VARIOUS SUMMER EVENTS

Maine has put a legal limit on crowd size at outdoor gatherings. This changes periodically, but remains (and will likely remain) at numbers far fewer than outdoor events usually have, and certainly hope for.

Three-fourths of Maine's State Agricultural Fairs (historically good venues for Bluegrass) have been canceled for 2020; most of the others are fall events and may yet cancel for 2020. The same is true for Maine's many LobsterFests, ClamFests, and similar events. July and August events have mostly been canceled. September and October events have not made a final decision yet.

#### MAINE BLUEGRASS JAMS

Both the Eastern Jam and the Southern Jam canceled their March and April jams. Both jams plan to open in the fall, but it remains to be seen when that will happen and what it will look like. Please keep checking the BMAM website and Facebook page for updates on the BMAM jams.

## LIVE MUSIC VENUES

Almost all Maine live music venues have been closed in April, May, and June. A few are beginning to open up and host live music, with strict limits on seating. A few venues are experimenting with live streaming music events. Some venues, such as Bigelow Brewing Company in Skowhegan, have outdoor show areas, and will have live music scheduled soon; however, in the event of rain, the music will be canceled. 317 Main Street Music School in Yarmouth has been hosting a number of weekday early evening outdoor concerts and open mics. Go to their Facebook page for more information. Some outdoor gazebo concerts are beginning to hold concerts; some have canceled their season; and some are undecided as of July 1st.



#### LIVE MUSIC ON SOCIAL MEDIA

Many bands/performers are using Facebook and YouTube. Erica Brown & Bluegrass connection, Darlin Cory, Town Mountain, Kruger Brothers and many more are performing online live to reach their fans and try to bring in some revenues. Please try to watch and support them.

If you are a Bluegrass performer please let BMAM help you promote your shows on social media by posting on our website calendar of events and you are welcome to share on our BMAM Facebook page.

## **SINGING AND COVID-19**

If you Google "singing and COVID-19," you will discover there are many articles on this topic. I'm not a scientist; I suggest that all singers and music fans research this yourself. From what I understand, the act of singing can potentially project airborne particles much further than, say, speaking at a normal volume; at the other end of the interaction, singers usually breathe more deeply than people just standing there or speaking softly; and so the risk can be quite high for singers, and quite high for the audience as well. There have apparently been documented cases of entire church choirs becoming infected after rehearsals. It would seem that singing and listening to singers outdoors is safer than singing or listening to singers indoors. I hope Maine Bluegrass people will read up on this topic and take measures to stay safe.

When it comes to masks, Bluegrass musicians and fans should keep up to date on Maine CDC rules and recommendations. Of course, it's very difficult to sing while wearing a mask. I've heard of one venue that's dealing with the situation by booking instrumental music only, and asking the musicians to wear masks while performing. Perhaps some jammers will stick to instrumentals in the early stages of getting back to normal.

# CD REVIEW — STARRY SUMMER NIGHTS - ROCK HEARTS

Rock Hearts is a fairly new bluegrass band centered in Rhode Island, but one member of the band, Bill Thibodeau, was a key bluegrass musician in Maine for over 30 years (from the early 1980s until 2012), so I'm sure many Maine bluegrass fans have been anxiously awaiting the release of their debut recording project. I just got a copy of their new mini-CD (8 songs), Starry Southern Nights, and I've been playing it regularly on my car stereo for the past three weeks. It's really, really good!

Here's a slight disclaimer: Bill's a good friend of mine, and one of the eight songs featured on the CD is "Whispering Waters," co-written by Bill and me — so I'm prejudiced. However, without risk of embarrassment, I'll stick my neck out and say: if you like solid bluegrass music, you will like this album!

The lead singing is great — real bluegrass singing; the vocal harmonies are soulful, aggressive, and lovely; and the banjo, mandolin, and fiddle playing is very, very impressive throughout — punchy, daring and creative, slick as a smelt. All rhythm elements are outstanding.

Every band Bill has been involved with has been a good solid band, but to be hon-

est, this project exceeded my expectations. I'd seen a couple of their videos online, and I thought: "Yeah, they're pretty good, like all the bands Bill has been in." But these guys have obviously been working it up. It feels like they've been playing these songs together for years (but still love playing them). Every instrumental break sounds natural and relaxed, but edgy, as well.

Joe Deetz is a cracker jack banjoist. Some fans may remember him from his days with Joe Val back in the 1990s. He's obviously a Scruggsbased traditionalist, but he gets some modern melodic runs in there, as well, and his timing is superb.

I don't think I'd ever heard the fiddling of Danny Musher before, but Liz and I were both immediately elated by his playing. His tone, timing, and creativity are undeniably great.

Of course I've always known about Bill's mandolin playing. In my opinion, Bill is among the top echelon of bluegrass mandolin players, period. On this album, he sounds wicked confident — like he's not trying to show off for other musicians, but just wants to make great music. Some of his licks are subtle and understated, but always exceptionally tasteful. Some of his licks just light it up.

Lead singer Alex MacLeod is a really good lead singer (and he wrote the well-crafted song "Starry Southern Nights"). I don't know where he comes from, but he sounds southern — solidly bluegrass all the way. Bill sings the tenor, Joe the baritone, and they sound like they've been singing together a long, long time (which they have not — they must have practiced a lot.)

The project was recorded at Dark Shadow Recording by Stephen Mougin, and technically everything is top-notch.

The album will be available on August 30 for downloads and CDs. The first single will be "99 Year Blues," with new lyrics by Maine's Ted DeMille. Other highlights include "Wake Up and Smell the Coffee;" penned by the great Bill Smith, one of Maine's all-time best bluegrass musicians.

I just learned that Rock Hearts is the subject of a feature article in the July 2020 issue of Bluegrass Unlimited magazine. Great bluegrass music by a band that features one of Maine's great bluegrass musicians, including 4 songs written or co-written by Mainers! This is an album worth hearing!

#### A FEW OLD MEMORIES

The image of this Bill Monroe & His Bluegrass Boys 1955 Grand Ole Opry Concert Poster is from an original cardboard Hatch Show Print window card advertising bluegrass legend Bill Monroe and his Blue Grass Boys in concert at the Classic Theatre in Watertown, Wisconsin on Friday, October 28, 1955. The poster is offered at Heritage Auctions www.HA.com for an undisclosed amount

As Heritage Auctions reports this original concert window card was printed on cardboard by Hatch Show Print in Nashville, TN. Hatch was a prolific printer of concert posters in the 1940's - 1960's and beyond. They're also known as the one major printer who almost never credited themselves on their posters.

This is the only known existing specimen of this exact poster. Hatch did not keep one from every date on a tour, the storage would've been prohibitive. They were usually satisfied to keep just one or two different examples from any given tour. Most had a very small number written on the back to note the year, and were then quarter-folded down to fit into a file cabinet, which is how the company seemingly kept one example of every poster they printed. The posters were all opened up and flattened out decades ago, however, and usually the fold remnants have receded quite a bit into the background, not being very obtrusive. It's a welcome trade-off for the rescue of hundreds of historic concert posters which otherwise would've become completely ex-


