



ROLAND WHITE, BLUEGRASS STAR AND MAINE NATIVE, DIES IN NASHVILLE

Mandolinist Roland White, a major bluegrass artist for 60 years, died in Nashville, Tennessee on April 1, 2022. His passing saddened many Maine bluegrass fans simply because he was a great player and singer, known for his work in several important bands, including the innovative Kentucky Colonels, Bill Monroe and the Bluegrass Boys, the Country Gazette, Lester Flatt & the Nashville Grass, and the Nashville Bluegrass Band.

Some Maine fans who appreciated White's accomplishments and skills may not realize that he was a Mainer until he was 16 years old – born as Roland Joseph LeBlanc in Madawaska on April 23, 1938. His family had migrated to Maine from New Brunswick, shortly after which the family anglicized the "LeBlanc" to "White." Ro-



land started playing country music with his siblings Clarence, Eric and Joanne, in Lewiston. Like many Mainers of French-Canadian descent, Roland grew up speaking French.

In 1954, the family moved to California, and Clarence and his brothers, having heard a Bill Monroe recording of "Pike County Breakdown," began playing bluegrass as The Country Boys, a band that featured Roland's slick mandolin playing, Clarence's innovative guitar stylings, and superb vocal harmonies.

With Billy Ray Latham on banjo, Leroy McNees on dobro, and Roger Bush eventually replacing brother Eric on bass, the Country Boys got a break when they were featured on two episodes of the Andy Griffith Show. Roland served in the Army in Germany for two years, after which the band re-formed as the Kentucky Colonels.

The Colonels toured extensively across the US in the early sixties and recorded several influential albums that are still in print today. Clarence's guitar work was particularly impressive; influenced by Doc Watson, but adding many innovations of his own, he was one of the most influential early flat pickers in a bluegrass band setting.



MAINE BLUEGRASS PIONEER ROSALIND (PRINDALL) CLANCY

Rosalind Lincoln (Prindall) Clancy (AKA Roz or Rozie) passed unexpectedly at her home Sunday morning May 15, 2022. Roz was well known for her role in bluegrass, where she was a member of the family band known as The Prindall Family, with her mother, father, and her younger sister Joey. They traveled all over Maine and New England performing at bluegrass festivals through most of her life. Roz had the wonderful opportunity to sing at the Grand Ole Opry when she was younger. She was asked to go on Kitty Wells' Farewell Tour when she was in her 30s, which she declined to stay home to take care of her two daughters.

Roz was in management at the Atrium Hotel in Brunswick, Maine for many years, where she managed the restaurant and all functions held there. Roz also had a deep love for horses, the Appaloosa horse in particular. She sat on the board of directors for the Maine Appaloosa Horse Club for 10 years where she was not only a board member, but also served as the secretary for 6 or those 10 years.

ALL IS RIGHT IN THE WORLD OF ERICA BROWN & THE BLUEGRASS CONNECTION

When the sound is right, you know it within the first few seconds...or in the first two measures, if that's how your brain works. With Erica Brown and the Bluegrass Connection's new record, *Blue Pine Moon*, you'll never have to play the "Is it bluegrass?" game. From mandolinist Matt Shipman's opening stroke to the everybody-in fiddle tune finish, there is no doubt about this album's pedigree.

All the elements are in place: precise, professional musicianship; excellent timing and tone; and a varied song selection that includes numbers from the likes of Hazel Dickens, Bobby Osborne, and Jim and Jesse McReynolds. Still, the skeptic may ask, "Is all of that enough, though? I mean, there are lots of good pickers around. But do they play together? Is the chemistry there, the old magic?" Short answer: Yes. It is all there.

Like any truly good record in any genre, Blue Pine Moon covers many miles. The band's rendering of songs such as Osborne's and Pete Goble's "Windy City" (a marvelous showcase for Erica Brown's vocals, by the way) and "When Your Phone Don't Ring (It'll Be Me)," by Hank Cochran and Glenn Martin, reminds the seasoned listener of the meaningful connection that once existed between bluegrass and country music - old country, that is, real country music. They harken back to the days when one could usually find a couple of Bill Monroe songs on a good honky-tonk's jukebox.

The songs take us to other places, too, each of them worth the ride. For instance, Ronnie Bowman's "Longing for the Old Days" seems handmade for Lincoln Meyers' warm baritone, and Chris Stuart's "Paul and Peter Walked" is offered up with the verve and cadence of an old-time camp meeting. Meanwhile, Matt Shipman has chipped in a couple of well-crafted working-man songs, entitled "C & O" and "Timberline."

As an instrumentalist, Erica Brown is well-regarded for her versatility, having played for years in the French Canadian and Irish traditions, but her contribution to this collection, the Kenny Bakeresque "Moonstruck Waltz," attests to her mastery of bluegrass at this point in her career. The sense that all of the puzzle pieces have found their proper places seems to have occurred to her as well, as she recently told BMAM: "This is the very first Erica Brown & The Bluegrass Connection album. I've recorded several solo albums in the past which have featured members of the band but this is the first full length album as a band. Jason Phelps at Acadia Recording was a dream to work with... Pat Keane (also at Acadia) did a fabulous job with the mastering. When you combine their skills and talents, you end up with a top notch sounding album."

Clearly, there is much more to say about this record than a few column inches can accommodate. The more the listener digs, the more it shines. Erica's singing and fiddling demonstrate considerable maturity and command, and her abilities are well complemented by Shipman's lively picking and unadorned vocals; Eli Gilbert's banjo playing shows the kind of finesse and clarity that can only result from hours, weeks, and years of practice; Lincoln Meyers' guitar playing, as always, brims with power but is still somehow restrained and tasteful; bassist Kris Day does not simply "hold things down"; he stokes the fire and drives the engine. Best of all, the Bluegrass Connection is a unit: they make space for one another, they support one another. Everyone plays on every tune, and everyone contributes to the vocal palette. Put it all together with the accomplished Jason Phelps in front of the studio soundboard, and you can't really go wrong.

The result is a very fine album that expresses an abiding love for this great musical form.

After Clarence left the Kentucky Colonels to play rock music, Roland soon had an opportunity to join Bill Monroe and the Blue Grass Boys, and recorded nine songs with them. In 1969, right after Flatt & Scruggs broke up, he started a 4-year stint, with Lester Flatt and the Nashville Grass. In 1973, the White brothers — Roland, Clarence and Eric — revived the Kentucky Colonels, but the revival ended in tragedy when a car crashed into Roland and Clarence as they were loading their equipment after a gig; Roland suffered minor injuries, but Clarence was killed in the accident.

Roland joined the progressive Country Gazette, and played with them for 13 years, after which he put in 13 years with the influential Nashville Bluegrass Band. In 2000, he formed the Roland White Band, which was active up until the time of his death.

Roland was a well-known teacher, holding many workshops and publishing a number of instructional tapes and CDs. Roland's mandolin style was traditional and yet innovative, and often had a humorously creative and playful character.

From his obituary in the Nashville Tennessean:

The news of Roland White's passing sparked hundreds of personal tributes on social media from around the globe. Friends and fans recalled his unfailing generous nature, on and off stage. When performing he would regularly share the spotlight, inviting youngsters, new faces and long time friends to join him on stage. He generously shared his experience and knowledge with multitudes of mandolin enthusiasts across the country and abroad. Many reflected on how Roland welcomed them as new arrivals in Nashville and it was he who was the first to offer his endorsement in a town that can be daunting to a newcomer. Roland loved playing and was a stalwart performer as well as participant at jam sessions for years at The World Famous Station Inn where he also curated a yearly tribute to Bill Monroe as well as organizing benefits for fellow musicians in need. It was in this welcoming and generous spirit that certified Roland as a beloved Ambassador for Bluegrass Music and Music City



BMAM – MCMHOF COLLABORATE TO CELEBRATE THE 50 TH ANNIVERSARY OF MAINE'S 1ST BLUEGRASS FESTIVAL

In honor of the 50 th Anniversary of Maine's 1st Bluegrass Festival, the Maine Country Music Hall of Fame and Museum has partnered with the Bluegrass Music Association of Maine to dedicate a room at the museum to bluegrass music in Maine. The bluegrass music room has exhibits of bluegrass artists and bluegrass promoters. The current exhibit features many of the MCMHOF inductees who performed at this festival.

Maine's 1st Bluegrass Festival was held on July 23, 1972 in Phippsburg. The Pine Tree State Bluegrass Music Association organized this festival and Maine Country Music Hall of Fame & Dung Museum inductee, Jimmy Cox was instrumental in organizing it.
